

God Is Still Making All Things New


In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth (Genesis 1:1). These words pierce the fabric of reality, through space and time. In the year 1900, God decided to carry out his work of making all things new in the new congregation called Christ Lutheran Church. In this year, 2025, we celebrate that our God has been at work making all things new in the midst of Christ


May we live the grace of Christmas every day, only without all the trappings: May we give generously, receive gifts gratefully, welcome others, and study your life.


