

God's Mystery of Making All Things New

This year, as we are celebrating 125 years of God making all things new at Christ Lutheran Church, we are sharing stories and memories of how God has been at work. I thought that I would take the time to share with you one of my favorite stories from Christian history. As the universal church on earth, all our stories are connected, and this one has had a profound influence on me ever since I can remember.

One of my favorite figures in church history was a Scottish man, who lived in the 5th century AD. His name was Succetus. Succetus lived in the

Roman province of Britannia, in modern day Scotland. His mother was a native Scott but his father was an imperial Roman of some repute. Succetus' father was also a deacon in the church and himself the son of a Christian priest.

However, Succetus, unlike his father and grandfather, was not a Christian. When he was sixteen years old, he was kidnapped from his home and smuggled across the Irish sea where he, as a slave, looked after the sheep of his captors. During his time of captivity, Succetus had a life changing experience. He wrote that something moved within him. And he became a Christian. He said that he wasn't searching for this, but it was purely a gift from God. In his early twenties he escaped from his captors and went back home.

Succetus would eventually become a bishop in Britannia, after which he did something quite profound. One day he had a vision, and in that

vision, he was told to return to Ireland to the land of his captors and proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ. So, he did. God used this man to proclaim the Gospel of grace, the favor that he has for all in and through Jesus Christ, and he did so to those who had once kept him in bondage. He became an unlikely missionary.

God used Succetus to transform the hearts of thousands during his own life. Through his ministry, God built up the church in Ireland, and so that those who lived in darkness would experience God's favor by means of the one whom they

> enslaved. This is how God has worked all over the world. He sent his apostles out to the ends of the earth. Without people like Succetus, we wouldn't be here right now.

Because of God's grace, those who walked in darkness have seen a great light. Succetus himself took on another name—a preferred name: Patrick. That's the name by which many know him today.

St. Patrick wrote a lot about his travels and his ministry—the story of his life. You can read these writings in his *Confessions*. I highly recommend reading it if you ever get the chance. It's clear that, because of his own situation, Succetus (Patrick) truly understood the grace of God. Patrick writes that because of the grace of God given to him, he was compelled to preach the gospel everywhere, confidently, and without fear, "so that after my death I may leave it to my Gallican brothers and

to my sons, many thousands of whom I have baptized in the Lord. And I was neither worthy nor deserving that the Lord should so favor me, his servant, after such afflictions and great difficulties, after captivity, after many years, as to grant me such grace for this nation—a thing which, still in my youth, I had neither hoped for nor thought of." Patrick put everything on the line and his own personal baggage and trauma aside to Ireland and for the sake of God's grace. And his witness is known even to this day.

Like Patrick, there is no way for us to know what God has in store for our lives. God is making all things new, but how he does this in our lives is often mysterious and unpredictable. We could probably say the same about his work through Christ Lutheran Church. We can only lift our hearts to him seeking his will and following where he leads that those around us would also be blessed. While we at Christ Lutheran Church can look back on the last 125 years, we don't know what our God has in store for the next 125. May he bless our future as he has blessed our past along with those who have gone before us, like Patrick. God is still making all things new.

Consider using this prayer as you come to God, asking for the bold desire to be bearers of the good news:


y Gracious God,


• I pray for confidence to share your Word with others and for the opportunity to proclaim it. Forgive my reluctance, my timidity.


