

Waters of Hope

The Bible begins: In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters. Genesis 1:1-2 gives us a picture of the deep waters of creation and the Spirit of God resting above them, blowing over them, guarding and keeping them, even in the darkness. For the Ancient Israelites, the waters were a place of fear, chaos, and uncreation.

The sea was something to be tamed and even someday overcome. The Philistines, the great enemies of Israel, were

associated with the "sea people" and worshipped a nautical god. When Jonah wanted to flee the presence of God, he went to the sea. Yet, God showed Jonah that he was present even in the cold, dark chaos.

Our God commands the sea itself. The psalmist writes: He made the storm be still, and the waves of the sea were hushed. Then they were glad that the waters were quiet, and he brought them to their desired haven. (Psalm 107:29-30). In Matthew 8, we read: Then Jesus rose and rebuked the winds and the sea, and there was a great calm. And the men marveled, saying, "What sort of man is

this, that even winds and sea obey him?" Jesus, God in the flesh, commands the sea.

In Exodus 14, we read: Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and the LORD drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night and made the sea dry land, and the waters were divided. And the people of Israel went into the midst of the sea on dry ground, the waters being a wall to them on their right hand and on their left. Our God demonstrates power over the sea, and he also

brings his people through it: salvation through the deep. The psalmist writes: *He divided the* sea and let them pass through it, and made the waters stand like

a heap (Psalm 78:13). Jesus, God in the flesh, goes even further. He does not divide the sea. He simply walks on top of it. When he walks on the water to approach his disciples who are in the boat, he tell them, "Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid" (Matthew 14:27).

God commands the cold, dark waters of creation and uses those same waters to bring about salvation for his people. Even further, our God uses those very same waters for recreation. We see this in the baptism of Jesus. Matthew writes: *And when Jesus was baptized, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened*

to him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him; and behold, a voice from heaven said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:16-17). The Spirit of God not only hovers over the waters, but he also hovers over Jesus as he is called the Son of God.

That gift is for us too. Though Jesus was begotten of the Father before all time, through the waters we too get to enter the family of God. When Paul was in Ephesus, he came across a group of gentiles and baptized them. Luke writes: On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. And when Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came on them, and they began speaking in tongues and prophesying (Acts 19:5-6). The waters of creation are sometimes turbulent and intimidating. They even have the power to kill. But when our God kills, he also makes alive. Through the water, God blesses us with the gift of his Spirit. Now, the Holy Spirit dwells in us.

The Spirit, in the waters of baptism, brings us restoration and hope. These waters of hope turn us into something new. Paul writes, *Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come* (2 Corinthians 5:17). It's no accident that, when this creation has passed away and the new creation dawns, John writes: *Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more* (Revelation 21:1). In the end, the sea will have served its purpose.

In this turbulent world, we face the waters of hope. They are waters that bring us to nothing so that we might be made new—a new identity in Christ. May you rest in the hope of our Lord who continues to make all things new.
